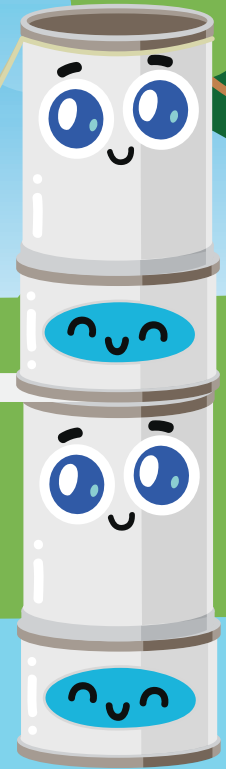


# Activity Time Recycled City



Reusing our waste  
to create something new is  
a good way to reduce the  
amount of rubbish we  
throw away!



This activity will give you an insight into how much waste is generated over a given time period. Over the next week, collect recyclable waste from around your home that can be reused to create your favourite landmark from the city.

Use the table below to take note of the different materials you collect and when you have enough, make a sculpture from the city!

Material	Amount

**Top Tip:** Try placing items like tin cans or jars on top of each other to make towers for height or cut windows and doors out of cardboard boxes to make them look like buildings - **get an adult to help you!**

**Take photographs of your finished piece or if you are able to carry it, bring it in to show the class!**

## Research Activity

**Choose one of the materials you have used to create your landmark and research the process used to recycle that material. Write up what happens to the material from the moment you no longer need it to the journey it then goes on to be turned into something new!**

**Tip: Talk about how you dispose of the material - does it go in a bin at home or does it need to be taken somewhere? the processes it goes through - what are those, how many are there? and include examples of what the item could be turned into.**
